Sharon Dennett, our Education Committee Chairperson, has led the membership group in several exciting multi-hour sessions using a new method of examining case material. This method was developed over the course of six years during meetings held by the European Psychoanalytic Federation Working Party. The details of this method are contained in the book Psychoanalysis Comparable and Incomparable: The Evolution of a Method to Describe and Compare Psychoanalytic Approaches which is edited by David Tuckett. The purpose of this method is not to provide supervision but to understand what the practitioner is doing and why they might be doing it. This allows psychoanalysts from different theoretical schools to understand each other in a process designed to be non-judgmental. For our group, engaging in this process has allowed us to grapple with the definitions of basic psychoanalytic concepts and methods. Working together in this way has helped our membership group understand each other in more complex ways and has promoted significant interest in our Scientific Meetings. We would like to thank the anonymous psychoanalyst from outside our area who has graciously shared her process notes with us.
